AASHTO CPBM/TPM Pooled Fund Joint Quarterly Meeting Notes September 3, 2020, 2:00 PM – 4:00 PM EDT

- Welcome and Agenda. CPBM Chair Tim Henkel welcomed attendees to the second Joint AASHTO Committee on Performance-Based Management / Transportation Pooled Fund quarterly meeting. He noted that we are working in difficult times and appreciates the time everyone is spending to help grow TPM while juggling other activities. He shared the purpose of the quarterly web calls is to share AASHTO and CPBM Committee information and updates with CPBM members and TPM Pool Fund Members and to get input on TPM needs. By bringing the two groups together, we're able to better meet the needs of the TPM community. - AASHTO Update. Christos Xenophontos provided an AASHTO update on behalf of Matt Hardy.
 - AASHTO staff are continuing to work from home, and will continue to do so through the end of the year.

 - There is a limited chance for federal reauthorization this year, and efforts are being focused on getting an extension.
- **FHWA Update.** Nelson Hoffman from the FHWA TPM team provided a TPM capacity-building update on behalf of TPM Team Leader Susanna Reck.
 - Nelson provided an update on several FHWA Performance Management Forum (PMF) portal resources including:

- Nelson reminded TPM Pooled Fund member state attendees to participate in the edX training pilot.
- Matt Haubrich (Iowa DOT) asked about the edX evaluation process. Nelson responded that the evaluation period will continue throughout the pilot.
- There was discussion about a discrepancy between RITIS, which assumes if a TMC has no speed data these data points should be left out and guidance from FHWA indicating that these segments should be regarded as reliable. The CATT Lab will be updating the RITIS tool to align with FHWA's guidance. Rich Taylor added that the measure covers the entire NHS, so all the TMCs must be part of the calculation. - Pond Partners provided an overview of the TPM Training Roadmap & Action Plan. Hyun-A Park from Spy Pond Partners provided an overview of the TPM Training Roadmap & Action Plan, which fulfills a key objective of the TPM Pooled Fund to provide a comprehensive program for TPM capacity-building. The development of the roadmap will be iterative. It is a partnership between FHWA, AASHTO and the TPM Pooled Fund. The TPM Pooled Fund Peer Exchange last November and NCHRP 20-24(127) (in progress) served as inputs to the prioritization of training needs.

 - MODA course this course is completed and pending publication on TC3.
 - TAM course updated to align with the TAM guide, this course is nearing completion and publication on TC3.
 - Communication series (upcoming) including:
 - Visualization 101
 - Visualization Techniques Using the NPMRDS
 - Visualization Case Studies (based on work by the AASHTO Visualization Committee)
 - Building Communication Products (using videos)
 - edX courses offered as a pilot to TPM Pooled Fund members (which also provides the opportunity to complete certifications):

- Asset Management Matt Haubrich (Iowa DOT) provided an update from the Asset Management subcommittee.
 - The focus of the subcommittee is on meeting the needs of asset management professionals at DOTs through building community, supporting research, communicating information and providing resources. The subcommittee closely collaborates with TRB's TAM Committee, and has joint monthly meetings with this group.
 - The summer TAM Mega-Meeting occurred in July 2020 and had 66 state DOT participants and 208 total participants.

- Annual TAM Community Survey of asset management professionals to look at needs in the asset management community.
- Organizational Management Deanna Belden (Minnesota DOT) and Charlie Purcell (Iowa DOT) provided an update on the work of the OM subcommittee. This committee has a close partnership with the TRB Workforce Development and Organizational Excellence Committee (AJE15) and meets monthly jointly with this group.
 - Activity 1 Process improvement (led by Gary Vansuch from Colorado DOT). The next Transportation Lean Forum (TLF) webinar is scheduled for October 29, 2020 at 9 AM Mountain Time.
 - Activity 2 Non-system performance measures (led by Deanna Belden). This activity is currently partnering with AJE15 in supporting development of TRB workshop planning on advancing organizational excellence at the virtual TRB Annual Meeting.
 - Activity 3 Supporting the Agency Capability Building (ACB) Portal (led by Charlie Purcell). This resource is hosted on the AASHTO Transportation Hub. Three levels of support for the ACB Portal have been outlined for prioritization and development through this activity.
- Risk Management Jean Wallace provided an update from the risk management subcommittee.
 - See the slide deck for the updated charter purpose and goals.
 Meeting are on the 2nd Monday of even-numbered months at 1 PM Eastern.
 - The subcommittee recently launched two new research projects:
 - NCHRP 20-123(04) Strategic Planning Session and Development of a Risk-Management Research Roadmap.
 - NCHRP 23-09 Scoping Study to Develop the Basis for a Highway Standard to Conduct an All Hazards Risk and Resilience Analysis.
 - The subcommittee also had one 2021 NCHRP Problem Statement selected for funding – Prioritization of Risks Related to Connected and Automated Vehicles and Emerging Technologies.
 - The subcommittee has one ongoing project as part of the NCHRP 20-44 implementation series – Implementation of the AASHTO Guide for Enterprise Risk Management.
 - The subcommittee annual subcommittee meeting is in October 2020.
 Stay tuned for more details.
 - The subcommittee will be partnering with the asset management subcommittee on updating risk registers for TAMPs.
- System Mobility and Emerging Technology Daniela Bremmer (Washington State DOT) provided an update on the subcommittee.

- This new joint subcommittee recently conducted a survey regarding the use of transportation data and data needs for decision makers, measuring on COVID-19 system mobility impacts and outcomes. There are a range of data availability and use among states.
- The subcommittee has conducted several collaborative information sharing sessions related to:

- Other topics of interest to the subcommittee include:
 - FCC5.9 GHz Spectrum Reallocation AASHTO and private sector partners are lobbying to preserve this space for transportation use.
 - AASHTO recently announced several inner-committee working groups for emerging technologies. Several members of the subcommittee recently developed an inventory of all committees throughout AASHTO, TRB, etc., related to emerging technologies.
 - Next steps:
 - The subcommittee would like to revisit the COVID-19 survey.
 - They will continue their bi-monthly meetings.
 - They plan to develop an NCHRP 20-123 proposal to develop a strategic action plan and a research strategy roadmap.

Coordinating Subcommittee Updates

- Policy and Rulemaking Christos Xenophontos provided an update from the coordinating committee on behalf of Lynn Zanto and Paul Degges.
 - As mentioned earlier, there is a limited chance for federal reauthorization this year.
 - AASHTO is focusing on making sure there are no new measures, as well as less burden and more flexibility for states.
 - Transportation policy forum efforts include a COVID-19 backstop and long-term extension.
- Professional Development and Technical Services John Selmer (Iowa DOT) provided an update from the coordinating committee. The current focus of the subcommittee is to relaunch the CPBM newsletter as the CPBM/TPM Newsletter, in cooperation with the TPM Pooled Fund. The coordinating

- committee met with CPBM subcommittee chairs to prioritize future newsletter topics. The first edition will be launched in conjunction with a series of COVID-19 videos in early October.
- Research Tammy Haas (New Mexico DOT) provided an update on the activities of the coordinating committee. This group meets on the second Friday of each month at 10 AM Eastern Time. Tammy welcomed anyone interested in TPM research to attend future meetings.
 - The coordinating committee is busy working with each of the technical committees to coordinate NCHRP problem statements (due on November 2, 2020).
 - Another priority of the organizing committee is to determine a tracking method for research projects, including when they are complete, their publication number, key milestones and implementation status.
