

AASHTO Committee on Performance Based Management (CPBM) Subcommittee on Asset Management (SAM) Secretary Position Description

Background

The CPBM is continuously looking to enhance our Leadership Team with individuals that are active in the Performance, Risk, Organizational, and Asset Management community. In addition, the leadership of the CPBM looks to promote diversity, including racial, gender, geographic, etc., and to help create the next generation of TPM leaders through mentoring. This includes the Secretary of the Asset Management Subcommittee.

Asset management is a strategic and systematic process of operating, maintaining, upgrading, and expanding physical assets effectively throughout their lifecycle. It focuses on business and engineering practices for resource allocation and utilization, with the objective of better decision making based upon quality information and well-defined objectives.

The focus of the Subcommittee on Asset Management is on the development, implementation, and use of asset management principles related to the condition and performance of physical assets and its effect on the performance of the multimodal transportation system in order to optimize the condition of an agency's assets given available resources. The subcommittee provides an opportunity for collaboration concerning best practices in asset management and concentrates on equipping state transportation agencies with tools and strategies to leverage opportunities.

The Secretary for this Subcommittee works with the Chair and Vice Chair to implement the Subcommittee strategic plan, support subcommittee meetings, coordinate with other AASHTO committees/subcommittees, and advance relevant research topics. - Apply expertise and knowledge of current and emerging asset management issues at State DOTs.

- Help implement Subcommittee strategic plan.
- Coordinate with other CPBM Subcommittees and AASHTO/FHWA staff. It is helpful to be involved with other AASHTO and TRB committees, in particular as a member or friend of ACF18 and/or AQB13.
- Plan meetings, workshops, and webinars to advance technical activities and sharing of best practices in support of member needs.

- Support and participate in the development of related research needs statements for potential funding through NCHRP or other research programs.
- Support subcommittee meetings (third Tuesday every other month, 2:00-3:00pm Eastern), including preparing agendas, coordinating with speakers, developing meeting topics, and taking and distributing meeting notes.
- Facilitate discussion among Subcommittees with an open-minded approach to establish a balanced policy perspective for the CPBM and AASHTO.
- Recruit new members and mentor current members.
- Support from DOT leadership to participate.
- In the role as secretary, serve as member of the CPBM Leadership Team. This means attending monthly CPBM Leadership Team meetings (typically 90 minutes long each).
- Time Estimate-: 2-3 hours per month (increases during research development)
